### THE LAND

- The Tribes sold their former reservation as willing sellers
- The Tribes receive 92,000 acres with taxpayers' money
- The Tribes, as a sovereign nation, could trade it for public forest land
- Potential loss of access to and use of National Forest land
- Loss of tax revenue
- Land for water is nothing less than blackmail

#### THE DAMS

- Estimated cost for removal at \$4 billion
- Loss of green energy to 70,000 households
- Loss of tax revenue from John C. Boyle Dam, etc.
- No credible science to help the fish
- Release and/or removal of 20 million cubic yards of sediment
- Reduced property values from draining the reservoirs
- No significant historical salmon runs above Spencer Creek

#### THE WATER

- No guaranteed water for irrigators
- Federal agencies can still use the ESA, BO, and CWA to shut off the water
- Agreement advocates Tribes control over the basin's water
- Tribal claims are for more water than what is available in most years
- Water could be sold to the highest bidder

This <b>agreement</b> was hammered out "in secret" behind closed doors. This is not just
about The Tribes, the land or the water; it's about you and your rights to have a voice in
this decision. In order for an agreement to be an agreement, it
needs to be agreeable to all parties.
